

OUR COMMUNITY

On August 17, 2003, a convoy of decorated, honking vehicles made its way in procession from the historic Anglican Church of St. Nicolas near Hastings and Boundary to the site that was previously known as the "little brown church" of Christ the King in Brentwood. People from the two churches had joined together as a community in the year 2000, and were now beginning a new ministry in this place as the Parish of St. Timothy. We aspire:

sharing the good news of Jesus Christ,
under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.*

All are welcome in this house of God. We gather as a faith community on Sundays at 10 am to sing, pray, learn, and share the bread and the wine. All seekers of Christ are invited to the table. KidsChurch is offered during part of the service for our younger members.

During the week many other forms of service go on in this building. We have many community groups which meet here (ask at the Parish Office). Hospital visits and pastoral calls to the sick and housebound are carried out. Bible study and fellowship groups are ongoing. We

have seniors and young families, singles and couples. There are friends waiting for you here.

OUR CHURCH

The Parish of St. Timothy is a member of the Anglican Church of Canada and the worldwide Anglican Communion. Anglicans have been worshipping in this building since it was erected in 1956. In 2003, renovations made the site accessible with a wheelchair ramp and mechanical lift to the lower hall and a handicapped accessible washroom. In 2017, we added a commercial-grade kitchen

You will notice symbols of our heritage from both St. Nicolas and Christ the King. The "Christus Rex" (Christ Triumphant) carving on the Eastern wall and the stained-glass windows and plaques from St. Nicolas are examples. We welcome back those who have had an association with our former identities.

If you are inquiring about weddings, baptisms, or confirmation, please speak to the priest or the Church Office regarding catechism and preparation in the Anglican Church. Facilities are also available for

funerals, receptions, and other group functions.

OUR SAINT

Timothy was a first century apostle from Lystra, in what is now Turkey (see Acts 16). His mother was Jewish; his father Greek. His multicultural background enabled him to bridge the differences between groups in the early church. While still a teenager, he converted to the Christian faith with his mother and grandmother. After meeting the apostle Paul, Timothy accompanied him on many missionary journeys around the Mediterranean.

He is known as a teacher, a preacher, an encourager, and a planter of new church communities. We have chosen Timothy as our patron saint as a symbol of what we too can do together as the body of Christ. Timothy is mentioned in the New Testament letters of Acts and Romans, and is specifically addressed by Paul in the letters of 1 and 2 Timothy. Our prayer is that, like Timothy, “everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, *equipped for every good work*” (2 Tim 3.17).

OUR OUTREACH

St. Timothy’s is involved in the neighbourhood. We are the depot for the Greater Vancouver Food Bank on Thursdays. Community events such as our Fall Pet Blessing help to connect us with

our neighbours. We do advocacy work to bring about a just and respectful society, and we support larger projects through our regional Church partners. As well, our meditation garden and outdoor labyrinth are always open to passers-by in need of spiritual refreshment.
