

We welcome you at St. Timothy's on this joyful Easter morning. May you experience the risen Lord Jesus in this sacred space. Our Christian community worships joyfully in the fellowship and service in discipleship.

To maintain a peaceful atmosphere, please put any electronic devices into "prayer mode" and refrain from chattering in the church.

All baptized Christians are welcome to share the bread and the wine at this communion table. If you wish to receive bread to eat, cup both your hands to receive a piece. The communion assistant will then offer you a sip of wine from the chalice. If your tradition is to dip the bread into the wine, put out one hand to receive a wafer.

Those who prefer to kneel for communion are invited to use the altar rail and receive by intincture (dipping the wafer). Tell the priest if you want a blessing instead of bread and wine, or if you need a gluten-free wafer.

If you are interested in learning more about the sacraments of baptism or holy matrimony, please speak to our priest Stephanie. After Easter, a Bible Study on the gospel of Matthew will be continuing on Wednesday April 23 at 7:30 pm. To arrange a home visit or communion, contact the parish office. Healing prayer is also part of our regular Sunday service on the fourth Sunday of each month.

This Great Vigil is the first service of Easter. We gather from the darkness of Good Friday to celebrate the Resurrection with light, story, song, and prayer. We begin outside on the labyrinth with the kindling of fire, the blessing and lighting of the Pascal candle, and then process into the church building.

The Vigil of the Word

We recount the work of the Living Word throughout history, singing verses of this hymn between readings: "This Ancient Love"

Holy Baptism

We gather at the font to welcome Margaret Penelope Hill into the body of Christ.

Presentation and Examination of the Candidate

Sponsors: We present Margaret Penelope to receive the sacrament of baptism.

Celebrant: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

Sponsors: I will, with God’s help.

Celebrant: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Sponsors: I will with God’s help.

Celebrant: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Sponsors: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Sponsors: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Sponsors: I renounce them.

Celebrant: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?

Sponsors: I do.

Celebrant: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Sponsors: I do.

Celebrant: Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

Sponsors: I do.

Thanksgiving Over the Water

The Baptismal Covenant

Celebrant: Let us join to renew our baptismal covenant.

Do you believe in God the Father?

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Celebrant: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Celebrant: Will you continue in the apostle’s teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

All: I will with God’s help.

Celebrant: Will you persevere in resisting evil and , whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

All: I will, with God’s help.

Celebrant: Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

All: I will, with God’s help.

Dismissal

Celebrant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

All: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

All: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you respect the integrity of creation?

All: I will, with God's help.

The Baptism

Margaret is baptized in the name of the Trinity, signed with oil of chrism, and wrapped in a white garment to show that she is now Christ's own. She is also given a candle to symbolize the light of Christ.

Celebrant: Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness into light.

All: Let your light so shine before others, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

Celebrant: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All: We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The Peace

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

We share a sign of God's peace with those around us as appropriate with a handshake, embrace, kiss, or smile.

Recessional Hymn: CP 408 "Wind Upon the Waters"

We resume our Easter celebration by gathering in the pews facing the font, which is filled with water from the baptism. We light the Pascal (Easter) Candle to begin the liturgy.

The Gathering and Asperging

Celebrant: God the creator, the rock of our salvation, has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins. May this water be a reminder to you all of your baptism, and may our Lord Jesus Christ keep us faithful to our calling, now and forever.

All: Amen.

Processional Hymn: CP 203 "Jesus Christ is Risen Today"

During the hymn, all are sprinkled with water as a reminder of baptism.

Greeting

Celebrant: Alleluia! The Lord is risen.

All: The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!

Celebrant: May his grace and peace be with you.

All: May he fill our hearts with joy.

Celebrant: Almighty God,

All: to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hidden. Cleanse the

thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Collect of the Day

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

All: *It is right to give our thanks and praise.*
