- 4 Some wandered in desert wastes; *
they found no path to a city where they might dwell.
- 5 They were hungry and thirsty; * their spirits languished within them.
- 6 Then in their trouble they cried to the Lord, *
and you delivered them from their distress.
- 7 You led them on a straight path * to go to a city where they might dwell.
- 8 Let them give thanks to you, O Lord, for your steadfast love *
and your wonderful works for all people.

- 11 Because they rebelled against the words of God *
and despised the counsel of the Most High.
- 12 So you humbled their hearts with hard labour; *
they stumbled, and there was none to help.
- 13 Then in their trouble they cried to the Lord, *
and you delivered them from their distress.
- 14 You led them out of darkness and gloom *
and broke their bonds asunder.
- 15 Let them give thanks to you for your steadfast love *
And your wonderful works for all people.
- 16 For you shatter the doors of bronze * and break the iron bars in two.
- 17 Some were fools and took rebellious paths; *
through their sins they were afflicted.
- 18 They loathed all manner of food * and drew near to death's door.
- 19 Then in their trouble they cried to the Lord, *
and you delivered them from their distress.
- 20 You sent forth your word and healed them * and rescued them from the grave.
- 21 Let them give thanks to you, O Lord, for your steadfast love *
and your wonderful works for all people.

- 22 Let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving *
and tell of your deeds with shouts of joy.
- 23 Some went down to the sea in ships *
and plying their trade in deep waters;
- 24 They beheld the works of the Lord * God's wonderful works in the deep.
- 25 Then God spoke, and a stormy wind arose, *
which tossed high the waves of the sea.
- 26 They mounted up to the heavens and descended to the depths; *
their souls melted away in their peril.
- 27 They staggered and reeled like drunkards *
and all their skill was of no avail.
- 28 Then in their trouble they cried to the Lord, *
and you delivered them from their distress.
- 29 You stilled the storm to a whisper *
and silenced the waves of the sea.
- 30 Then they were glad when it grew calm, *
When you guided them to the harbour they desired.
- 31 Let them give thanks to you, O Lord, for your steadfast love *
and your wonderful works for all people.
- 32 Let them exalt you in the assembly of the people *
in the council of the elders, let them sing hallelujah!
- 33 You change rivers into deserts, * and water-springs into thirsty ground,
- 34 Fruitful land into salty waste, *
because of the wickedness of those who dwell there.
- 35 You change deserts into pools of water *
and dry land into water-springs.
- 36 You settle the hungry there, * and they establish a city to dwell in.
- 37 They sow fields, and plant vineyards, * and bring in a fruitful harvest.
- 38 By your blessing they increased greatly; *
You do not let their herds decrease.
- 39 Yet when they are diminished and brought low, *
through oppression, trouble, and sorrow,
- 40 You pour contempt on princes * and make them wander in trackless wastes;
- 41 But you lift up the poor out of misery *
and multiply their families like flocks of sheep.
- 42 The upright see this and rejoice, * but all wickedness shuts its mouth.
- 43 Whoever is wise will ponder these things, *
and consider well the Lord's steadfast love.
