Kitchen Renovation Progress Update:

We have submitted an application for a tenant improvement permit to the City of Burnaby. Copies of the plans have also gone to the Health and Fire Departments. Conversations with the three departments are ongoing. Hopefully, the permits will be in hand and the budget firmed up before the architects leave on August 23 for a four-week vacation.

Obviously, there will be no construction this summer. The needs of Treasure Island II may do as much to determine our timeline as our budget and funding do. Stay tuned for updates as we get more information.
