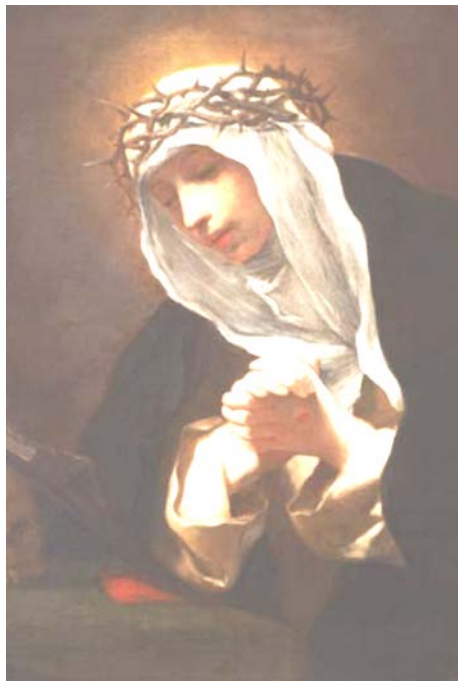

5. Are there any changes in your life as a Good Steward that the passage encourages you to make to be more dependent on God's refuge and strength?
6. St. Catherine of Sienna, much like the repentant man on one of the three crosses, was devoted to God. Like her, do you see God as your refuge and strength, helping you when you are in trouble?
