Interim FAQ – Why can't we just keep the Interim Priest-in-Charge? This question is flattering to your Interim Priest-in-Charge (you like me! you really like me!), but, no matter how great a fit we might be as priest and parish, the work of the Interim still needs to happen. No matter how hard we work as priests to keep our own agendas from overriding collaborative leadership, we are key leaders in a parish's life.

Additionally, every rector has particular gifts and skills – some areas of a parish's life will get more or less attention based on those gifts and skills. Over time as a parish, we can forget that we're not doing more of **X** because the Rector doesn't really like that work and assume we just don't do **X** here. When a rector leaves, it is necessary for the parish to evaluate its current life (who are you now?) and reflect on the future directions (who are you becoming?) before calling a new rector.

It is the work of the Interim Priest-in-Charge to care for the parish and encourage the evaluative work. The normal pattern is for the Interim Priest-in-Charge not to be considered to be the next rector. This prevents the priest from treating the whole Interim period as one long job interview and frees her to tell difficult truths and encourage hard decisions. It can also let the Parish experiment with a different leadership style or personality or quality about a priest that they might not be ready to call as their rector. Got more questions?
