INTERIM FAQs – WHAT CONVERSATIONS DOES THE PARISH HAVE TO HAVE?

In order to move towards the creation of a Parish Profile and the call process for a new Rector, the parish of St Timothy needs to have some conversations. The Parish Profile, created by the Canonical Committee (made up of your wardens, Synod Delegates and Alternative Delegates), is a description of the parish which is used to attract clergy who might want to become your new Rector. It needs to describe who you are as a parish and where you think you might be headed. It needs to be accurate so that you and your new Rector are a good fit for each other.

In order to be ready to create a Parish Profile, the parish leaders need to check in with each other and the wider community of St Timothy's. We know you've done many kinds of visioning processes and the idea of sitting around a table talking about what kind of church you are and what kind of church you long to be may be unappealing. The reality is, of course, that for organizations like parishes these kinds of conversations are ongoing. We are always needing to cast our vision and check in to see if we're still headed in the same direction. We are conscious, however, of not wanting to have the same conversation in the same ways.

We've asked Caitlin Reilley Beck to assist us in having an initial conversation. Caitlin, you may know, is the Diocesan Missioner for Children, Youth, and Families; she is also a trainer in the Diocesan School for Parish Development. **Our first conversation will take place on Sunday, October 01, after worship. We will enjoy a catered lunch together as part of that time.** Please plan to attend and see Caroline (the Warden leading this work) or Pastor Ruth for more information.

In this worship service, we remember those who have died in the past year or whose deaths we continue to mourn. All are welcome to join us for a time of remembrance, contemplation, and prayer.

ST FRANCIS DAY PET BLESSING: We will have our annual Pet Blessings on St Francis Day, *Wednesday, October 4*. Blessings will be available on the Labyrinth from 7 to 8 pm. All leashed or caged pets are welcome; photographs of shy pets are also welcome. Pet and human treats will be available as well. We are looking for 2-4 volunteers to assist with providing human treats. Please see Pastor Ruth if you could assist.

SUNDAY MORNING ROLES: Liturgy is the work of the people and all of us can contribute to our worship time on Sunday mornings. This is an excellent time to (re)consider the roles you take on regularly. We are particularly looking for new members of the Altar Guild, additional Servers, and people to assist with Hospitality. We also always need people to greet visitors and regulars as they arrive for worship, read the Scriptures, led the Prayers of the People, assist with distributing Communion, count the Offerings, assisting with KidsChurch, and manage the PA system and audio recordings. CONFIRMATION, RECEPTION, AND REAFFIRMATION OF BAPTISMAL VOWS: These three rituals are ways in which we affirm or reaffirm our commitment to following the Way of Jesus Christ within the Anglican traditions. Those who have been baptized (particularly as infants or young children) *confirm* the promises and intentions set out for them in baptism. Those who have come to the Anglican church from other Christian traditions are *received* into the Church. And all who have been baptized can, from time to time, *reaffirm* their baptismal vows. If you feel that you or your child may be ready or interested in any of these rituals, please speak with Pastor Ruth.

ANGLICAN SPIRITUAL FORMATION RETREAT: The Diocese is offering a new weekend retreat for spiritual formation, called “For the Life of the World (Pro Mundi Vita)”. The two pilot weekends are October 13-15 (register by September 29) and October 27-29 (register by October 13). The format of the Retreat supports spiritual formation through personal encounters with God through the power of the Holy Spirit. Using creative structured exercises, music and art, each individual is empowered to reflect on her or his own faith journey, to experience refreshment in common prayer, to encounter Christ in the Scriptures, and to seek a time of contemplative rest in God and in community. RAISE THE ROOF



Dear Artabaner,

Our very special Camp Artaban has had a wonderful summer and continues to grow as we welcome both new and returning campers. With the end of camp season, we now turn our minds to upkeep. Camp itself looks amazing, thanks in large part to our dedicated Artabaners that have spent so many hours of work and love to make it all happen.

You may know that the dear old dining hall has half a new roof, but due to illness the roofer was unable to finish. This has become the number one priority. Secondly, one of Artaban's toilet facility, affectionately known as Port, needs a new roof, as a fallen tree has put a large hole in it! In July staff and volunteers painted the half of Port that can still be used, but it still needs some love and care.

We are excited to announce the **RAISE THE ROOF** fundraising campaign. The initial goal is to raise \$50,000 in order to complete the dining hall roof and re-roof Port. The secondary, long-term goal is to build an ongoing fund that enabling roofs around camp to be repaired on a rotating basis.

We are now accepting monetary donations which are earmarked for the Raise the Roof fund. We are hoping to finish both the dining hall and Port roofs before the start of Vancouver's rainy season.

This past summer, camper numbers nearly doubled from last year. This is amazing growth for one year. Campers coming off the boat were heard declaring that this was the best part of their summer and they wished they could have stayed longer. We welcomed some brand new young campers and saw some of our older campers move into leadership positions. Many volunteers came up as often as possible, reminiscing about past camps and sharing their enthusiasm with new and seasoned campers alike. As with any start up, general operating funds continue to

be an ongoing need to enable camp to bless children and adults next summer and for many years to come.

We are hoping to build a \$50,000 base for the operating fund. If you feel you can donate to this fund as well, we would welcome your support.
