The Proclamation of the Word

First Reading: Deuteronomy 34:1-12 (Kate Turcotte)	Bible pp. 191-192 OT
Psalm 90	

- 1 Lord, you have been our refuge; * from one generation to another.
- 2 Before the mountains were brought forth, or the land and the earth were born; *
from age to age you are God.
- 3 You turn us back to the dust and say; * :Go back, O child of earth".
- 4 For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past; *
and like a watch in the night.
- 5 You sweep us away like a dream; * we fade away suddenly like the grass.
- 6 In the morning it is green and flourishes; * in the evening it is dried up and withered.
- 7 For we consume away in your displeasure; *
we are afraid because of your wrathful indignation.
- 8 Our iniquities you have set before you; *
and our secret sins in the light of your countenance.
- 9 When you are angry, all our days are gone; * and we bring our years to an end like a sigh.
- 10 The span of our life is seventy years, perhaps in strength even eighty; *
yet the sum of them is but labour and sorrow,

for they pass away quickly and we are gone.

- 13 Return, O Lord; how long will you tarry? * be gracious to your servants.
- 14 Satisfy us by your loving-kindness in the morning; *
so shall we rejoice and be glad all the days of our life
- 15 Make us glad by the measurement of the days that you afflicted us; *
and the years in which we suffered adversity.
- 16 Show your servants your works; * and your splendor to their children.
- 17 May the graciousness of the Lord our God be upon us; *
prosper the work of our hands; prosper our handiwork.
