SALAL + CEDAR IS AGAIN HOSTING AN ECOLOGICAL STATIONS OF THE CROSS at Burnaby Mountain, on Saturday, April 15, from 2:30 to about 5 pm. We will walk about a 4-km loop of the park trails, making connections between the Christian story of crucifixion, death and burial, and the stories of environmental destruction we see around us. At different points on the trail, groups will host a 5 to 15 minute time of reflection - drawing from scripture and other writings.
